The English Studies Courses at Lincoln is unique in purpose and design. The recognition of the diverse linguistic and cultural backgrounds of the students is fundamental to the courses offered. The program is student-centered and responsive to student needs for broadening knowledge, skills and values fundamental to personal growth and basic to academic achievement through communicative competence. The courses in language, literature, and communication studies are designed to develop skills in both socio-cultural and applied areas.

Student learning objectives for English courses offered include demonstrably improved ability to comprehend and produce written and oral communications; to evaluate literature within its stylistic, interpersonal and intercultural contexts; and to employ systematic information processing strategies for critical thinking, problem solving and decision making.

The Department of English Studies offers two types of courses:

1. **General Education English** courses in language and communication studies.
2. **Core English** courses in language, literature, and communication studies for an **English Minor**.
3. Certificate **Intensive English Program (IEP)**, which will be described in the Certificate Section below.

CORE ENGLISH LANGUAGE, LITERATURE AND COMMUNICATION STUDIES

Core English courses include the study of language, literature, and communication. General English courses in language and communication studies fulfill the College's general education requirement for oral and written communication.

THE ENGLISH MINOR (18 UNITS)

The English minor is used to complement the business or computer science student's major field studies. The English minor offers students an opportunity to achieve improved conceptual skills, critical acumen, interpretive activity, and communicative proficiency within humanistic and applied contexts.

The goal of the English minor is to broaden the student's understanding through further study of language, literature, and communication systems, including modern modes of information processing. The English minor helps the student to explore the relationship between language use and informative and affective communicative purposes. Students selecting the English minor will choose six courses (18 units) from the three areas of language, literature, and communication:
